Major General Craig Q. Timberlake

Major General Timberlake enlisted in the Marine Corps in May 1977. He was meritoriously promoted to Staff Sergeant on 2 January 1982, commissioned through the Enlisted Commissioning Program in August 1984, and graduated from Mary Washington College, Fredericksburg, Virginia via the College Degree Completion Program in 1989.

Assignments in the Operating Forces include: Rifle Platoon Commander, Company Executive Officer, and Company Commander, 2d Battalion, 6th Marines; Company Commander and Battalion Operations Officer, BLT 1/1, 15th Marine Expeditionary Unit (SOC); Regimental Operations Officer, 1st Marines; Inspector and Instructor, 3d Battalion, 23d Marines; Chief of Staff, III Marine Expeditionary Force; Deputy Commanding General, III Marine Expeditionary Force and Commanding General, 3d Marine Expeditionary Brigade; Deputy Commander, Regional Command North, International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) Afghanistan; and General Third Marine Commanding Division (CALTRAP NATION) Okinawa, Japan.

Assignments in the Supporting Establishment include: Senior Drill Instructor, MCRD, San Diego; Plt Sgt and

PTI, OCS, Quantico, VA; Platoon Commander, Executive Officer, and Company Commander, Officer Candidates School; and Commanding Officer, Weapons and Field Training Battalion, MCRD Parris Island.

Headquarters and Staff assignments include Action Officer, Manpower Equal Opportunity Branch; Section Head, Manpower Military Policy Branch, Manpower and Reserve Affairs; South East Asia Plans Officer, Executive Assistant to the J5, and Deputy J54, U.S. Pacific Command; and Director, Manpower Management Division.

Military Education: Recruit Training, MCRD San Diego; DI School; Amphibious Warfare School; Marine Corps Command and Staff College; Naval War College; Joint Forces Staff College; and Capstone. He has been awarded a Master of Arts in Military Studies and a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies.

Major General Timberlake retired from active duty on 1 October 2018. He is married to Chief Warrant Officer 3 Belinda Vasquez-Timberlake, United States Marine Corps, Retired. They currently reside in New Braunfels, Texas with their daughters Kyra and Kalea.

Major General Timberlake has been awarded the Good Conduct Medal with bronze star in lieu of second award.

Major General Timberlake is the Chief of Student Leadership Development for the International Leadership of Texas (ILTexas). ILTexas is a public charter school that has over twenty-three thousand students spread over 22 campuses throughout central Texas.

There are veterans from every war era and conflict from WW 1 through today resting in this National Shrine.
